Katarokwi Learning Centre (KLC) is an alternative education centre within LDSB. The centre houses The River Program (indigenous), and KLC also supports students from grade 9 to 12+, who benefit from an alternative setting to a traditional high school. KLC is housed in a former elementary school. KLC is supervised by the Principal of Alt/Con Ed, and supported with a VP.

The success of KLC is in large part because of the community partnerships that it has nurtured. These include:

Special resources have also been used, including

Indicators of Success include total credits attained, school attendance rates, tracking engagement in programs offered, and outings/field trips, student survey and focus groups to get student voice.

What has been the impact on Student Learning?

Student engagement has increased with the addition of partnerships and a focus on providing students with multiple services through the site. A focus on engagement has meant a change in programming to offer programs and events that students are interested in and see as relevant to their futures. This change has resulted in improved attendance and engagement by students, which translates to greater attainment of credits. KLC obtains student voice from students, and uses that to plan forward and determine their next steps.
