We celebrate Aboriginal Culture at Moosonee Public School. Primary students learn their Cree language and the school environment encourages participation in the 7 Teachings.

We also demonstrate our appreciation for the Cree culture through our Aboriginal Focus Group activities. These activities promote an appreciation and awareness of cultural skills, traditions and art.

So far this year we have had the following Aboriginal activities: Teepee visit, beading, storytelling, traditional cooking, setting snares, fur preparation, making snares, step dancing, native art: sketching with pencil crayons and painting with acrylics, animals and their furs and tamarack bird making. Later in April, some classes will be making soap stone carvings and the Early Years Kindergarten classes will learn about mossbags and tikanagans when Ms. Burke brings in her new baby!
