Bill 98: The Better Schools and Student Outcomes Act, 2023

The Minister of Education, Stephen Lecce introduced this legislation on April 17, 2023. It received Royal Assent on June 8, 2023. The bill proposed changes to the *Early Childhood Educators Act, 2007*, the *Education Act*, and the *Ontario College of Teachers Act, 1996*.
